#### **Dear Sisters and Brothers,**



#### What a Start....

Once again, a blessed and fruitful New Year to everyone!!! We are just one week into the new year, and already it has been eventful, weather wise. In my six plus years in Jacksonville, this is the coldest it has been – not welcomed at all – and as I type this, its criminally cold outside and drizzling. Not very appealing kind of weather! But in the big picture, we have the better part of the weather system covering virtually the entire country. So, we cannot really complain.

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. With this celebration coming up at the beginning of the year, let us pray the good Lord to continue to manifest His graces and blessings in our endeavors throughout this year and beyond.

In the Catechism, we read: The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning towards the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament. The Epiphany shows that "the full number of the nations" now takes its 'place in the family of the patriarchs', and acquires Israelitica dignitas(is made 'worthy of the heritage of Israel'). (CCC, 528)

In addition, "In Mary, the Holy Spirit *manifests* the Son of the Father, now become the Son of the Virgin. She is the burning bush of the definitive theophany. Filled with the Holy Spirit she makes the Word visible in the humility of his flesh. It is to the poor and the first representatives of the gentiles that she makes him known." (CCC, 724)

The Christmas season ends tomorrow after the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The season that celebrates the birth of the Savior always gives us many opportunities to manifest Christ's love and presence to all. That revelation, of course, is not only for this season but for every moment of our lives.
