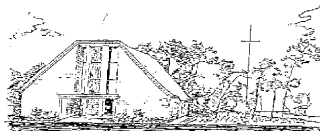

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Triune God

Happy Memorial Day to all, especially to all who served in the armed forces!!!

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the mystery of God. Following on the heels of our tri-parish Pentecost celebration, I cannot but think about the fact that, like the three persons in one God, we are three parishes called to and celebrating our unity of faith in more ways than one. So, like the God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, may we continue to show forth the face of God in love.

It should not come as a surprise that, in the *Catechism of Catholic Church*, there are a myriad passages and references about the mystery of God. As St. Paul says in the Acts of the Apostles, it is '...in him we live and move have our being.' (Acts 15.28). So continuing our journey with the *Catechism*, lets remind ourselves of some of the very salient points about the Trinity from the perspective of our readings today:

"The first 'profession of faith' is made during Baptism. The symbol of faith is first and foremost the *baptismal* creed. Since Baptism is given 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit', the truths of faith professed during Baptism are articulated in terms of their reference to the three persons of the Holy Trinity." (CCC, 189)

"Christians are baptized 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'. Before receiving the sacrament, they respond to a three-part question when asked to confess the Father, the Son and the Spirit: "I do." "The faith of all Christians rests on the Trinity." (CCC, 232)

"From the beginning, the revealed truth of the Holy Trinity has been at the very root of the Church's living faith, principally by means of Baptism. It finds its expression in the rule of baptismal faith, formulated in the preaching, catechesis and prayer of the Church. Such formulations are already found in the apostolic writings, such as this salutation taken up in the Eucharistic liturgy: 'The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.' (CCC, 249)

"*The Trinity is One*. We do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons, the 'consubstantial Trinity'. The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire: 'The Father is that which the Son is, the Son that which the Father is, the Father and the Son that which the Holy Spirit is, i.e. by nature one God.' In the words of the Fourth Lateran Council (1215), 'Each of the persons is that supreme reality, viz., the divine substance, essence or nature.'" (CCC, 253)

Obviously, this space is hardly enough to even begin to scratch the surface of trying to explain the trinity. So spending sometime on the catechism text is highly recommended.

The revealed truth of the Trinity is at the root of the Church's faith as expressed in the Creed. From the earliest days of the Church until present time, the formulation of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit can be found centrally in prayers, writings, and the liturgy. This belief is that there are three persons in one God, each of which is God, of the same nature and essence. And yet, also distinct from one another in origin: the Father generates, the Son is begotten, and the Spirit proceeds. (CCC # 249-254)

La verdad revelada de la Santísima Trinidad ha estado desde los orígenes en la raíz de la fe viva de la Iglesia como lo expresa el Credo. Desde los primeros siglos hasta la actualidad, podemos encontrar la fórmula de la Iglesia del Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo en oraciones, escrituras, y la liturgia. Esta creencia es que hay tres personas en un solo Dios, cada una es Dios, de la misma naturaleza y esencia Son distintos entre sí por sus relaciones de origen: "El Padre es quien engendra, el Hijo quien es engendrado, y el Espíritu Santo es quien procede". EWTN Airs Documentary on the Florida Martyrs

On June 6, at 10:00 p.m., famed "Miracle Hunter" Michael O'Neill's original EWTN series *They Might Be Saints* will air a special one-hour episode on the courageous and heroic witnesses who gave their lives for the Catholic faith during the Spanish missionary period. The cause for the Martyrs of la Florida was formally opened on Oct. 12, 2015, in Tallahassee and is currently being prepared for submission to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Rome.
