

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

“I am the Bread of Life”

Following the miracle of the loaves, the crowd clearly thought that, in Jesus they had found someone who would satisfy every material need as a priority. They could not be farther from the truth and Jesus’ ultimate goal. For Jesus, the material abundance was only a sign of a much greater and everlasting spiritual food. In the following verses of this portion of John’s gospel, Jesus gradually unfolds that reality.

But first Jesus establishes his identity and relationship with God the Father. We turn again to the *Catechism*:

“We believe and confess that Jesus of Nazareth, born a Jew of a daughter of Israel at Bethlehem at the time of King Herod the Great and the emperor Caesar Augustus, a carpenter by trade, who died crucified in Jerusalem under the procurator Pontius Pilate during the reign of the emperor Tiberius, is the eternal Son of God made man. He ‘came from God’, ‘descended from heaven’, and ‘came in the flesh’. For ‘the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father. . . And from his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace.’ (CCC, 423)

“Moved by the grace of the Holy Spirit and drawn by the Father, we believe in Jesus and confess: ‘You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.’ On the rock of this faith confessed by St. Peter, Christ built his Church. (CCC, 424)

“Christ himself declared that he was marked with his Father’s seal. Christians are also marked with a seal: ‘It is God who establishes us with you in Christ and has commissioned us; he has put his seal on us and given us his Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee.’ This seal of the Holy Spirit marks our total belonging to Christ, our enrollment in his service for ever, as well as the promise of divine protection in the great eschatological trial. (CCC, 1296)

“*The seal* is a symbol close to that of anointing. ‘The Father has set his seal’ on Christ and also seals us in him. Because this seal indicates the indelible effect of the anointing with the Holy Spirit in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders, the image of the seal (*sphragis*) has been used in some theological traditions to express the indelible ‘character’ imprinted by these three unrepeatable sacraments.” (CCC, 698)

In next weekend’s gospel passage, the matter of Jesus’ identity continues to be a point of conversation with the crowds. Before then however, Jesus identifies himself as the bread of life. He does so by using the expression ‘I am’, one that goes back to God’s revelation to Moses at the burning bush.
