

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

He is Risen!!!

Alleluia, Alleluia, the Lord is truly risen, alleluia. To him be glory and power for all the ages of eternity, alleluia, alleluia. (Lk. 24.34; Rev. 1.6) Here is wishing you and your family a very blessed and spirit-filled Easter. May the joy of the resurrection of Christ strengthen us in our moments of challenges. Amen.

The resurrection of Christ is the greatest and most fundamental mystery of our faith. The gospels of course allude to other mysteries also:

“The Gospels were written by men who were among the first to have the faith and wanted to share it with others. Having known in faith who Jesus is, they could see and make others see the traces of his mystery in all his earthly life. From the swaddling clothes of his birth to the vinegar of his Passion and the shroud of his Resurrection, everything in Jesus’ life was a sign of his mystery. His deeds, miracles and words all revealed that ‘in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily.’ His humanity appeared as ‘sacrament’, that is, the sign and instrument, of his divinity and of the salvation he brings: what was visible in his earthly life leads to the invisible mystery of his divine sonship and redemptive mission. (CCC, 515)

“‘Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen.’ The first element we encounter in the framework of the Easter events is the empty tomb. In itself it is not a direct proof of Resurrection; the absence of Christ’s body from the tomb could be explained otherwise. Nonetheless the empty tomb was still an essential sign for all. Its discovery by the disciples was the first step toward recognizing the very fact of the Resurrection. This was the case, first with the holy women, and then with Peter. The disciple ‘whom Jesus loved’ affirmed that when he entered the empty tomb and discovered ‘the linen cloths lying there’, ‘he saw and believed’. This suggests that he realized from the empty tomb’s condition that the absence of Jesus’ body could not have been of human doing and that Jesus had not simply returned to earthly life as had been the case with Lazarus. (CCC, 640)

“Jesus rose from the dead ‘on the first day of the week.’ Because it is the ‘first day,’ the day of Christ’s Resurrection recalls the first creation. Because it is the ‘eighth day’ following the sabbath, it symbolizes the new creation ushered in by Christ’s Resurrection. For Christians it has become the first of all days, the first of all feasts, the Lord’s Day (*he kuriake hemera, dies dominica*) Sunday: We all gather on the day of the sun, for it is the first day [after the Jewish sabbath, but also the first day] when God, separating matter from darkness, made the world; and on this same day Jesus Christ our Savior rose from the dead.” (CCC, 2174)

Easter Truth

The great Easter truth is not that we are to live newly after death, that is not the great thing, but that we are to be new *here and now* by the power of the resurrection; yes, Easter means we can live forever, but more critically, it means we can live nobly now *because* we are to live forever.

He is Not There !

In our sanctuaries and homes today, the symbols of Easter are all around us, a poignant reminder of what Christ has done, who He was. But the Easter Christ, the Risen Christ is not a memory, He is our future. Do not look for Him in Bethlehem or on the banks of the Jordan.

Make no nostalgic trips to the cross. Do not linger even at the empty tomb, He is not there!

So how do we find the Savior on this Easter morning? Look ahead. There is the triumphal Christ going before us into Galilee, ascending into heaven, sending the Spirit to comfort us. He sweeps down the road into the hearts and hands of His children to be. Those who seek will find Him in what He loved most: one another. He can be found in a mother's tear, a baby's laugh, a father's strong right arm. His voice whispers in a child's halting prayer and the hush of lullaby. His laughter echoes when we break bread in good company and his arms are the last to leave our shoulders when sorrow deepens our load.

Where is the Savior on this Easter day? He is here among us, alive and well. He lives in the heart beating inside you, and beside you, at work, at rest or play. Rejoice with Him this day, that you need look no further for your Savior than the next face you see. "For where two or three are gathered, there I will be also."

Christ is present in both the body and blood and in each of their parts so that in the breaking of the bread, Christ is not divided. Reception of Communion under both species, is also, the fullest sign of His real presence. (CCC#1377, 1390)
