

## **The Holy Trinity and Family**

**This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity; the first weekend we resume our pre-pandemic weekly schedule. During the past twelve months, we came together as a tri-parish family of faith in prayer, in study and in celebrating the Eucharist, both in-person and online, all in one worship space. And last Sunday, we auspiciously crowned it all with the celebration of Pentecost, a feast that brings together different backgrounds to give glory to God.**

**With today's celebration of the Holy Trinity, and even though for the most part we return to our individual parishes, we have another opportunity to think about and appreciate our faith family as a "sign and image" of the Trinity, just like our own individual families.**

**As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states. "The Christian family is a communion of persons, a sign and image of the communion of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit. In the procreation and education of children it reflects the Father's work of creation. It is called to partake of the prayer and sacrifice of Christ. Daily prayer and the reading of the Word of God strengthen it in charity. The Christian family has an evangelizing and missionary task..." (CCC, 2205)**

**Of course, pre-pandemic we had many occasions to come together and celebrate our faith, but this time has been unique and different. And I am confident that, for those who were able to come, we have gotten to know more of our sisters and brothers in the faith. Previously, we celebrated jointly a few times a year, but this time for a much longer time. And during this period, we also had a most wonderful Easter Vigil celebration with our Spanish-speaking community. That is family and faith in action.**

**Like the relationships within the family, these gatherings "... bring an affinity of feelings, affections and interests, arising above all from the members' respect for one another." (CCC, 2206) The overriding objective of course is evangelization and promoting God's kingdom and its values. The psalmist tells us, "How good and how pleasant it is, when brothers and sisters dwell together as one." (133.1)**

**As we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity let us pray that, this affinity of feelings, affections and interests continues to grow not only in our faith community but also in our society.**




