Dear Brothers and Sisters,

God and Caesar - 2020 III



With less than 72 hours to November 3rd, election day of the "most significant" election in a long time, here is the final installment of the series bothering on governance and citizenship from our catholic perspective. Let me begin this with the last paragraph from last week: "Submission to authority and co-responsibility for the common good make it morally obligatory to pay taxes, TO EXERCISE THE RIGHT TO VOTE, and to defend one's country: Pay to all of them their dues, taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honor to whom honor is due." (CCC, 2240)

The following paragraphs from the Catechism focus on the political community and the Church:

"Every institution is inspired, at least implicitly, by a vision of man and his destiny, from which it derives the point of reference for its judgment, its hierarchy of values, its line of conduct. Most societies have formed their institutions in the recognition of a certain preeminence of man over things. Only the divinely revealed religion has clearly recognized man's origin and destiny in God, the Creator and Redeemer. the Church invites political authorities to measure their judgments and decisions against this inspired truth about God and man: Societies not recognizing this vision or rejecting it in the name of their independence from God are brought to seek their criteria and goal in themselves or to borrow them from some ideology. Since they do not admit that one can defend an objective criterion of good and evil, they arrogate to themselves an explicit or implicit totalitarian power over man and his destiny, as history shows. (CCC, 2244)

"The Church, because of her commission and competence, is not to be confused in any way with the political community. She is both the sign and the safeguard of the transcendent character of the human person. 'The Church respects and encourages the political freedom and responsibility of the citizen.' (CCC, 2245)

"It is a part of the Church's mission 'to pass moral judgments even in matters related to politics, whenever the fundamental rights of man or the salvation of souls requires it. the means, the only means, she may use are those which are in accord with the Gospel and the welfare of all men according to the diversity of times and circumstances." (CCC, 2246)

So there you have it, or most of it, in these final hours leading to election day. Of course, millions have already cast their votes and others are doing just that even as you read this. In the end, which ever way the elections turn out – there are many of them actually – we do not lose sight of the values of God's kingdom to which are committed.
