

## The Sacrifice of the High Priest



It cannot be stressed enough the enormity of what happens at the Mass if we always recollect that, it is one and the same sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. The author of the letter to the Hebrews reminds us that, Christ our High Priest has offered one sacrifice for sins, and "...by one offering he has made perfect forever those who are being consecrated." We should not allow our familiarity with the Eucharistic sacrifice diminish the magnitude of what we celebrate and partake in.

"The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice: 'The victim is one and the same: the same now offers through the ministry of priests, who then offered himself on the cross; only the manner of offering is different.' 'And since in this divine sacrifice which is celebrated in the Mass, the same Christ who offered himself once in a bloody manner on the altar of the cross is contained and is offered in an unbloody manner... this sacrifice is truly propitiatory.' (CCC, 1367)

"Jesus gave the supreme expression of his free offering of himself at the meal shared with the twelve Apostles 'on the night he was betrayed'. On the eve of his Passion, while still free, Jesus transformed this Last Supper with the apostles into the memorial of his voluntary offering to the Father for the salvation of men: 'This is my body which is given for you.' 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.' (CCC, 610)

"The Eucharist that Christ institutes at that moment will be the memorial of his sacrifice. Jesus includes the apostles in his own offering and bids them perpetuate it. By doing so, the Lord institutes his apostles as priests of the New Covenant: 'For their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.' (CCC, 611)

"The cross is the unique sacrifice of Christ, the 'one mediator between God and men'. But because in his incarnate divine person he has in some way united himself to every man, 'the possibility of being made partners, in a way known to God, in the paschal mystery' is offered to all men. He calls his disciples to 'take up [their] cross and follow [him]', for 'Christ also suffered for [us], leaving [us] an example so that [we] should follow in his steps.' In fact Jesus desires to associate with his redeeming sacrifice those who were to be its first beneficiaries. This is achieved supremely in the case of his mother, who was associated more intimately than any other person in the mystery of his redemptive suffering. Apart from the cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven. (CCC, 618)

"Because it is the memorial of Christ's Passover, the Eucharist is also a sacrifice. The sacrificial character of the Eucharist is manifested in the very words of institution: 'This is my body which is given for you' and 'This cup which is poured out for you is the New Covenant in my blood.' In the Eucharist Christ gives us the very body which he gave up for us on the cross, the very blood which he 'poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.'" (CCC, 1365)

In one word, this is Mass we celebrate every day.
