

Dear Sisters and Brothers,



The Promise of the Holy Spirit

As Jesus gets ready for his passion and death, he prepares his apostles for his impending departure from them. Among other things, but prominently, Jesus gives the promise of the Paraclete, the Advocate that will be sent to them. In a couple of weeks, we will celebrate the event marking the advent of the Holy Spirit. Let us continue to invite the same Spirit into our faith community and into our personal lives.

"The eternal origin of the Holy Spirit is revealed in his mission in time. The Spirit is sent to the apostles and to the Church both by the Father in the name of the Son, and by the Son in person, once he had returned to the Father. The sending of the person of the Spirit after Jesus' glorification reveals in its fullness the mystery of the Holy Trinity. (CCC, 244)

"Before his Passover, Jesus announced the sending of 'another Paraclete' (Advocate), the Holy Spirit. At work since creation, having previously 'spoken through the prophets', the Spirit will now be with and in the disciples, to teach them and guide them 'into all the truth'. The Holy Spirit is thus revealed as another divine person with Jesus and the Father. (CCC, 243)

"When he proclaims and promises the coming of the Holy Spirit, Jesus calls him the 'Paraclete,' literally, 'he who is called to one's side,' ad-vocatus. 'Paraclete' is commonly translated by 'consoler,' and Jesus is the first consoler. The Lord also called the Holy Spirit 'the Spirit of truth.' (CCC, 692)

"Since Easter, the Holy Spirit has proved 'the world wrong about sin,' i.e., proved that the world has not believed in him whom the Father has sent. But this same Spirit who brings sin to light is also the Consoler who gives the human heart grace for repentance and conversion. (CCC, 1433)

"As St. Paul affirms, 'Where sin increased, grace abounded all the more.' But to do its work grace must uncover sin so as to convert our hearts and bestow on us 'righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.' Like a physician who probes the wound before treating it, God, by his Word and by his Spirit, casts a living light on sin: Conversion requires convincing of sin; it includes the interior judgment of conscience, and this, being a proof of the action of the Spirit of truth in man's inmost being, becomes at the same time the start of a new grant of grace and love: 'Receive the Holy Spirit.' Thus in this 'convincing concerning sin' we discover a double gift: the gift of the truth of conscience and the gift of the certainty of redemption. The Spirit of truth is the Consoler." (CCC, 1848)
