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Dear Sisters and Brothers,



The Spirit of Peace

On Pentecost Sunday, we rightly focus on and reflect on the celebration as the birthday of the Christian community, the Church. And a fundamental part of that beginning is the preaching of the good news in one language, but to the understanding of various groups with different linguistic and cultural backgrounds. It was a message and experience that brought together, to their amazement, individuals representing most of the known world.

Knowing what transpired on the day of Pentecost and considering the tragic events of the past few weeks and ongoing violence, I invite us to continue to invoke the Spirit to help us find ways to lasting peace. The Pentecost event, among other things, brings us into communion with God and with one another, regardless of our immutable characteristics. In our faith, we speak about the communion of saints. We can also speak about the communion of believers and that of citizens of society. Upholding that communion requires peace and it must begin with us as followers of Christ, the Prince of Peace.

“In every liturgical action the Holy Spirit is sent in order to bring us into communion with Christ and so to form his Body. The Holy Spirit is like the sap of the Father's vine which bears fruit on its branches. The most intimate cooperation of the Holy Spirit and the Church is achieved in the liturgy. The Spirit who is the Spirit of communion, abides indefectibly in the Church. For this reason the Church is the great sacrament of divine communion which gathers God's scattered children together. Communion with the Holy Trinity and fraternal communion are inseparably the fruit of the Spirit in the liturgy. (CCC, 1108)

“The epiclesis is also a prayer for the full effect of the assembly's communion with the mystery of Christ. ‘The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit’ have to remain with us always and bear fruit beyond the Eucharistic celebration. The Church therefore asks the Father to send the Holy Spirit to make the lives of the faithful a living sacrifice to God by their spiritual transformation into the image of Christ, by concern for the Church's unity, and by taking part in her mission through the witness and service of charity. (CCC, 1109)

“In the liturgy of the New Covenant every liturgical action, especially the celebration of the Eucharist and the sacraments, is an encounter between Christ and the Church. The liturgical assembly derives its unity from the ‘communion of the Holy Spirit’ who gathers the children of God into the one Body of Christ. This assembly transcends racial, cultural, social - indeed, all human affinities.” (CCC, 1097)

May the Holy Spirit transform and draw us closer to God and to one another.

A dove is often the first image we learn of the Holy Spirit. The gentle beating wings of God's love and power tapping at our heart. Or perhaps you think of fire, a consuming power, burning to share His message of love. Still others may call up Joel's words "I will pour out my spirit" and see the cool refreshing living water welling up in their hearts. Why do we need all these different pictures for one simple truth? Because the Spirit is as diverse as we need Him to be. God's Spirit must reach us individually where we are and touch the sleeping potential in our hearts to life. Can such divine inspiration come in just one standard size? Some of us need a lulling voice, others can hear only a trumpet blare. The gentle touch to shepherd one, the stricter rod to guide others. Because God loves each of His children equally He has given us a Spirit that can be what we need, when we need it. Just as on the first Pentecost, the Spirit brought diverse tongues to carry God's message of love and salvation to every heart, today He speaks to us in our own private language whispering the same words: "God loves you.
