

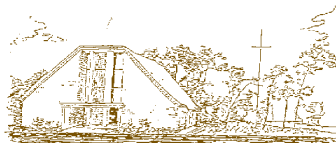

Take Heart! It Is I!

Are you under the impression as a mature Christian, that somehow if you really had enough faith, you would no longer be afraid? Ah, but we are afraid, aren't we? Afraid of all kinds of things and outcomes. We are afraid of failure and rejection, pain and suffering, being abandoned. So many times these fears prevent us from taking a step out of the boat and walking in faith. Today's reading is about St. Peter and a storm. In the story Jesus doesn't just speak His word of power and calm the seas. Instead, He tells Peter to get out of the boat and walk through the waves to Him even though he's frightened. Perhaps a strong faith isn't one that allows no fear, but like Peter's, a strong faith allows us to walk ahead through the storm even though we are afraid. Let's ask God for the courage to take that step, reminding us that Jesus is always waiting in the midst of any storm.

"His purpose also was that they might accomplish the work of salvation which they had proclaimed, by means of sacrifice and sacraments, around which the entire liturgical life revolves. August 27-28, Feast Day of St. Augustine & Augustinian Address

Join us at the Cathedral Basilica, 38 Cathedral Place in St. Augustine, in celebrating our Patronal Feast of St. Augustine of Hippo. Sunday Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Pohlmeier at 11 a.m. with a reception to follow in the rectory courtyard. On Monday, Bishop Pohlmeier will preside at Solemn Vespers at 6 p.m. followed by an Augustinian Address given by Dr. Mary Soha and a reception to follow in the rectory courtyard. The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates the dogma of the Church that Mary was taken body and soul into Heaven at the end of her earthly life. Although belief in Mary's assumption had been widespread since the third century, it was not until 1950 that Pope Pius XII declared the belief as dogma in his Apostolic Constitution Munificentissimus Deus. In it he writes, "the revered Mother of God ... finally obtained, as the supreme culmination of her privileges, that she should be preserved free from the corruption of the tomb and that, like her own Son, having overcome death, she might be taken up body and soul to the glory of heaven" (MD 40). The Solemnity of the Assumption is a Holy Day of Obligation.

La solemnidad de la Asunción de la Santísima Virgen María celebra el dogma de la Iglesia de que María fue llevada en cuerpo y alma al Cielo al final de su vida terrenal. Aunque la creencia en la Asunción de María se había generalizado desde el siglo III, no fue hasta 1950 que el Papa Pío XII declaró la creencia como dogma en su Constitución Apostólica Munificentissimus Deus. En ella escribe, "la reverenciada Madre de Dios ... finalmente obtuvo, como la culminación suprema de sus privilegios, que ella debería ser preservada de la corrupción de la tumba y que, como su propio Hijo, habiendo vencido a la muerte, ella podría ser tomada en cuerpo y alma para la gloria del cielo "(MD 40). La solemnidad de la Asunción es un Día Santo de obligación.
