The Rating Game

The equality of God's grace can be a two-edged sword. Those who think they are undeserving get more than they expected. Those who believe they are more deserving receive less than anticipated. In the Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard, the laborers who spent twelve hours in the vineyard got a denarius. The later hires who worked only one hour also got a denarius. Where's the fairness in that? Jesus' message meant that because we are all equal before God, no one is graded, or rated, or considered more valuable. No one gets ahead of the rest. There aren't four-star Christians or one-star Christians. We are each beloved, valued and precious children accepted into God's great love. And that is perfect fairness, no matter what we might think.
