The K of C #5407 will be selling Advent candles & calendars throughout the month of November. Other items will be available for purchase during the Advent Season.

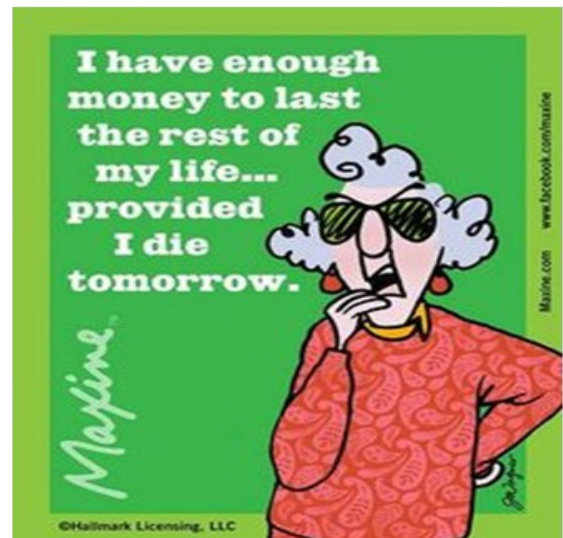
Please Make Note

Little Caesars

Although the world we live in today is radically different from Jesus' world, there are some similarities. People in Jesus' day had to pay taxes, and so do we. So Jesus' admonition (and excellent response to being trapped) that people should give to Caesar what is Caesar's and give to God what is God's should directly apply to our lives today just as it did in 33 A.D. But there is a deeper dimension here as well. In this century, the most fearsome Caesar we face isn't our government, but the tyranny of our own self interest. The tightrope we balance our time and budgets on is slick with grease of life's activities and amusements. By concentrating so much on getting what we want, or think we need, God is squeezed out of the picture. To follow Jesus' simple division of money and loyalty, we need to topple the empire of self and become a responsible tenant of God's Kingdom, paying Him the rent He is owed with our time, talent and treasure.

They do indeed impart grace, but, in addition, the very act of celebrating them most effectively disposes the faithful to receive this grace in a fruitful manner, to worship God duly, and to practice charity” (SC, # 59).
